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

Fr. Scott's Corner



While Mary the Blessed Mother is revered and celebrated all year long, May is a special month to celebrate our "Queen of Heaven." In our Catholic tradition, we dedicate May to honoring and seeking the intercession of Mary as the Mother of God and the Mother of the Church.

May has been Mary's month since medieval times. The month signifies the end of winter and the start of a new season of growth. It's a time for new beginnings and it encourages us to be grateful and deep in our devotion to Mary.

Mary is the "Queen of Heaven" and the first among all the disciples. One of my favorite titles for Mary is 'Theotokos'. It comes from the Greek and means 'Christ Bearer'. I suspect each of you, as you are reading this article, could come up with at least 25 titles that we give to Mary, including Our Lady of Mercy, Queen of the Universe, Our Lady of Hope, Our Lady of Sorrows, Mary, Star of the Sea, Our Lady of Perpetual Help, and the list goes on.

Pope Francis, in his Gaudete et Exsultate, no. 176, wrote "She is that woman who rejoiced in the presence of God, who treasured everything in her heart, and who let herself be pierced by the sword. Mary is the saint among the saints, blessed above all others. She teaches us the way of holiness and she walks ever at our side. She does not let us remain fallen and at times she takes us into her arms without judging us."

As Pope Benedict XVI reflected in Deus Caritas Est (Dec. 2005), "Outstanding among the saints is Mary, Mother of the Lord and mirror of all holiness. Mary's greatness consists in the fact that she wants to magnify God, not herself. She is lowly: her only desire is to be the handmaid of the Lord (cf. Lk 1:38, 48)."

Mary, as the first among the disciples, can lead us to her son Jesus "so that we too can become capable of true love and be fountains of living water in the midst of a thirsting world."

At Mercy Home for Boys & Girls, we have a great love for our Blessed Mother. More than 138 years ago, Mercy Home was first established as the Mission of Our Lady of Mercy. Each President of Mercy Home throughout our history, including me, have had a great love and devotion to Mary.

I am going to encourage all of you to spend time in prayer with Mary, perhaps by praying the rosary or following her in the Scriptures. In doing so, we draw closer to the Immaculate Heart of Mary, which is a heart of love for all of us. Let's take this moment to pray Mary's prayer.

Hail Mary, full of grace, the Lord is with thee; blessed art thou among women and blessed is the fruit of thy womb, Jesus. Holy Mary, Mother of God, pray for us sinners, now and at the hour of our death. Amen.

Partners in Prayer

Eleanor doesn't know where she got her love for learning. All she remembers is that she was always eager to find out everything she could about every subject she could think of.

But Eleanor's natural curiosity for education didn't come from her home life. Her mom dropped out of high school, and never encouraged Eleanor to study. And her father abandoned the family when Eleanor was only a baby. Soon after he left, Eleanor's mother began leaving her with family friends as often as she could. She spent her money recklessly, often not leaving enough to feed her child.

When Eleanor was with her mother, they lived in run-down apartments in dangerous neighborhoods. Sometimes they didn't have heat, and Eleanor had to sleep on the floor when her mother couldn't afford furniture. Her mother took every opportunity to be out of the house.

Because of this, Eleanor was left alone a lot growing up. Maybe that's why she often begged her mother to let her go to school, even before she was old enough to start kindergarten. She loved watching TV shows like "Jeopardy" with her grandmother, eager to gather any knowledge she could.

But despite this passion, Eleanor struggled in school, often receiving only Cs and Ds on her report card. She had no problems with attendance—she was eager to attend every day. But at home, there was no place to do homework, no proper nutrition, and rarely a good night's sleep. Eleanor often did not turn in assignments, found it hard to pay attention in class, and even fell asleep at school. It became clear that over time, Eleanor's home life was destroying her education. The lack of support at home showed in her grades.

Eleanor's mother eventually left her with her grandmother full-time, no longer wanting what she viewed as the burden of raising a child. But Eleanor's grandmother had many health issues and wasn't prepared to raise another child. She gave Eleanor as much support as she could, but it soon became clear that she wouldn't be able to provide the care Eleanor needed.

The turmoil in Eleanor's life didn't help her grades, either. When she failed seventh grade, her grandmother knew that she needed to find additional resources to help. She turned to Mercy Home.

Eleanor quickly became involved in our Summer Enrichment program, which allows our children to stay engaged with learning throughout the summer. They also found her a new school to start in the fall where she would receive more support.

At first, Eleanor struggled with the structure and rules at Mercy Home. She rebelled whenever she could. But once school started, she began to have a dramatic turnaround. Her new school had the resources to give her more one-on-one attention, and she was thrilled to see the way her grades improved.

With the support of Mercy Home coworkers and tutors, Eleanor was turning in her homework, studying regularly, and showing up to school prepared for success. As she brought home more As and Bs, her confidence grew. Finally, she could focus on school the way she always wanted to, without having to worry where she would sleep or if she would eat.

Now in high school, Eleanor is a serious student with big dreams for the future! She can't wait to go to college and hopes to become a teacher so that she can pass on her love for learning and help kids who struggled, just like she did.

None of this would be possible without loving friends like you. Thank you for your prayerful support of Mercy Home's children.







FIRST READING

A reading from the Acts of the Apostles 5:27-32, 40b-41

When the captain and the court officers had brought the apostles in

and made them stand before the Sanhedrin, the high priest questioned them, "We gave you strict orders, did we not, to stop teaching in that name?

Yet you have filled Jerusalem with your teaching and want to bring this man's blood upon us."

But Peter and the apostles said in reply, "We must obey God rather than men.

The God of our ancestors raised Jesus, though you had him killed by hanging him on a tree.

God exalted him at his right hand as leader and savior to grant Israel repentance and forgiveness of sins.

We are witnesses of these things, as is the Holy Spirit whom God has given to those who obey him."

The Sanhedrin ordered the apostles to stop speaking in the name of Jesus, and dismissed them.

So they left the presence of the Sanhedrin, rejoicing that they had been found worthy to suffer dishonor for the sake of the name.



SUNDAY, MAY 11 FOURTH SUNDAY OF EASTER - YEAR C

FIRST READING

A reading from the Acts of the Apostles 13:14, 43-52

Paul and Barnabas continued on from Perga and reached Antioch in Pisidia.

On the sabbath they entered the synagogue and took their seats.

Many Jews and worshipers who were converts to Judaism followed Paul and Barnabas, who spoke to them and urged them to remain faithful to the grace of God.

On the following sabbath almost the whole city gathered to hear the word of the Lord.

When the Jews saw the crowds, they were filled with jealousy

and with violent abuse contradicted what Paul said.

Both Paul and Barnabas spoke out boldly and said, "It was necessary that the word of God be spoken to you first.

but since you reject it and condemn yourselves as unworthy of eternal life, we now turn to the Gentiles.

For so the Lord has commanded us,

I have made you a light to the Gentiles,
that you may be an instrument of salvation
to the ends of the earth."

The Gentiles were delighted when they heard this and glorified the word of the Lord.

All who were destined for eternal life came to believe, and the word of the Lord continued to spread

through the whole region.

The Jews, however, incited the women of prominence who were worshipers

and the leading men of the city, stirred up a persecution against Paul and Barnabas, and expelled them from their territory.

So they shook the dust from their feet in protest against them,

and went to Iconium.

The disciples were filled with joy and the Holy Spirit.

FIRST READING

and made a considerable number of disciples, they returned to Lystra and to Iconium and to Antioch.

They strengthened the spirits of the disciples and exhorted them to persevere in the faith, saying, "It is necessary for us to undergo many hardships to enter the kingdom of God."

They appointed elders for them in each church and, with prayer and fasting, commended them to the Lord in whom they had put their faith.

Then they traveled through Pisidia and reached Pamphylia. After proclaiming the word at Perga they went down to Attalia.

From there they sailed to Antioch, where they had been commended to the grace of God for the work they had now accomplished.

And when they arrived, they called the church together and reported what God had done with them and how he had opened the door of faith to the Gentiles.

FIRST READING

A reading from the Acts of the Apostles 15:1-2, 22-29

Some who had come down from Judea were instructing the brothers,

"Unless you are circumcised according to the Mosaic practice, you cannot be saved."

Because there arose no little dissension and debate by Paul and Barnabas with them, it was decided that Paul, Barnabas, and some of the others should go up to Jerusalem to the apostles and elders about this question.

The apostles and elders, in agreement with the whole church,

decided to choose representatives and to send them to Antioch with Paul and Barnabas.

The ones chosen were Judas, who was called Barsabbas, and Silas, leaders among the brothers.

This is the letter delivered by them:

"The apostles and the elders, your brothers, to the brothers in Antioch, Syria, and Cilicia of Gentile origin: greetings.

Since we have heard that some of our number who went out without any mandate from us have upset you with their teachings and disturbed your peace of mind, we have with one accord decided to choose representatives and to send them to you along with our beloved Barnabas and Paul,

who have dedicated their lives to the name of our Lord Jesus Christ.

So we are sending Judas and Silas who will also convey this same message by word of mouth:

'It is the decision of the Holy Spirit and of us not to place on you any burden beyond these necessities, namely, to abstain from meat sacrificed to idols, from blood, from meats of strangled animals, and from unlawful marriage.

If you keep free of these, you will be doing what is right. Farewell."

A reading from the Book of Revelation 21:10-14, 22-23

The angel took me in spirit to a great, high mountain and showed me the holy city Jerusalem coming down out of heaven from God.

Its radiance was like that of a precious stone, like jasper, clear as crystal.

It had a massive, high wall,

with twelve gates where twelve angels were stationed and on which names were inscribed,

the names of the twelve tribes of the Israelites.

There were three gates facing east,

three north, three south, and three west.

The wall of the city had twelve courses of stones as its foundation,

on which were inscribed the twelve names of the twelve apostles of the Lamb.

I saw no temple in the city

for its temple is the Lord God almighty and the Lamb.

The city had no need of sun or moon to shine on it, for the glory of God gave it light, and its lamp was the Lamb.
